Venturing above 15,000 feet? The High-Altitude Evacuation Package provides services to members 16 years of age and older who travel above 15,000 feet (4,600 meters) during any part of their climbing or trekking trip and who require emergency transport due to injury or illness.

As an enhancement to that leadership, our **Mountain Advisory Council** helps us stay continuously attuned to always-evolving situations in the mountaineering world so we can keep our services topnotch when it comes to meeting the mountain community's needs. This includes active guidance from Mountain Advisory Council members Ed Viesturs, mountaineering legend and Jed Williamson, outdoor adventure safety expert and longtime mountaineering author.

FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS

Q. Does Global Rescue have any restrictions on activities or elevation?

A. No. Global Rescue does not exclude or restrict the elevation or activities of members. If you're adventuring to higher elevations, our High-Altitude Evacuation Package provides services to members age 16 years and older who travel above 15,000 feet (4,600 m) during any part of their trip (excluding air travel) and who require emergency transport due to injury or illness. Keep in mind higher elevations may hinder the ability of aircraft to reach a member in need.

Q. Does Global Rescue provide services in remote areas?

A. Yes. When outside of regions with organized emergency services (ie: 911 in US, 999 in EU, and 211 in UK), Global Rescue provides emergency field rescue services from the point of illness or injury to the nearest medical facility for treatment and stabilization.

Q. Will medical evacuation get me home if I'm hurt or injured?

A. Yes. The Global Rescue membership includes medical transport to your home country hospital of choice if you're hospitalized as an inpatient 100+ miles from home, require additional hospital care and are fit to fly.



If you're a person who's active, who's outdoors, who travels, it's crazy to not have Global Rescue. The membership is so valuable compared to the potential expenses. My rescue on Mount Everest in 2016 would have cost me about \$20,000, compared to the few hundred dollars I paid for the membership.

Q: If I need to be rescued, should I arrange my own evacuation?

A. No. For Global Rescue member benefits to apply, all emergency rescue or transportation services must be provided and managed directly by Global Rescue. Self-arranged transport — including those coordinated by third parties — are not eligible for benefits or reimbursement.

Q. What happens if I have altitude sickness?

A. Any member suffering symptoms of Acute Mountain Sickness should not ascend any higher, should descend and contact Global Rescue as soon as possible. Global Rescue's medical teams are trained to assess members with symptoms of Acute Mountain Sickness and are supported by Global Rescue's staff physicians, including a leading authority on altitude-related issues. Many times, cases requiring in-patient hospitalization may need evacuation or transport services. Global Rescue has performed thousands of rescue and evacuation missions in the Himalaya, Andes, Karakoram and other regions at high altitude.
